ture is attributed to Frank Lloyd Wright. It was known as a uniquely American style, free of previous conventions.

Wright designed approximately sixty Usonian houses, many of which survive today. The houses were typically small with an emphasis on natural materials, flat ceilings, cantilevered overhangs and clerestory windows for natural light and passive cooling.

All you have to do is glance at the photo above to observe how all of these elements are articulated here.

This current-day masterpiece (only 1,850 sq. ft.) is from artisan builder, Kelly Ramsey. He coined the term :

> As instantly appealing as the home is, there is an exotically beautiful architectural feature here you've never seen anywhere: the home includes two open-air rooms that are PART of the main house (seen above, right side).
